



ORDINANCE

REMOVING THE PROVISION FOR THE PRESIDENT OF THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN TO ASSUME A COMMITTEE CHAIR

CITY OF NASHUA

In the Year Two Thousand and Eleven

The City of Nashua ordains that Part I “Administrative Legislation”, Chapter 5 “Administration of Government”, Article II “General Provisions”, Section 5-9 “Standing committees” of the Nashua Revised Ordinances, as amended, be hereby further amended by deleting the struck-through language as follows:

“§ 5-9. Standing committees.

- A. The president shall serve as an ex officio member of all standing and special committees of the board of aldermen, except the finance committee. The president shall count as an additional member of a standing or special committee for the purpose of establishing a quorum at every meeting he or she attends. The president shall have a vote on every committee, except the finance committee and the joint special school building committee, regardless of the appointed members present and voting. ~~The president may assume the chair of any committee, except the finance committee and the joint special school building committee.~~ The president may appoint himself or herself as one of the alderman-at-large members of the finance committee per Charter Section 50.”

All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

This ordinance shall become effective upon passage.
