



ORDINANCE

AMENDING THE STARTING TIME OF PARKING METER AND PAY STATION HOURS FROM 8:00 A.M. TO 9:00 A.M.

CITY OF NASHUA

In the Year Two Thousand and Thirteen

The City of Nashua ordains that Part II “General Legislation”, Chapter 320 “Vehicles and Traffic”, Article XI “Parking Meters”, of the Nashua Revised Ordinances, as amended, be hereby further amended as follows:

1. In Section 320-50 “Parking time limits on streets”, delete the struck-through language and add the new underlined language as follows:

“320-50. Parking time limits on streets.

A. Except as otherwise provided, the time limit during which the parking meter regulations shall be effective in streets shall be as follows:

- (1) In Zone I and Zone II: from 89:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. daily.
- (2) In Zone III: from 89:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. daily.

...”

2. In Section 320-49 “Time limits in parking lots”, delete the struck-through language and add the new underlined language as follows:

“§ 320-49. Time limits in parking lots.

A. Time limits in parking lots shall be as follows:

- (1) In Zone I, from 89:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m., daily, except for Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays, with a ninety minute time limit.
- (2) In Zone II, from 89:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m., daily, except for Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays, with a one hundred and twenty minute time limit.

- (3) In Zone III, from ~~8~~9:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., daily, except for Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays, with no time limit.
- B. Overnight parking of private passenger vehicles shall be permitted in all public parking lots between the hours of 8:00 p.m. and ~~8~~9:00 a.m.”

This ordinance shall become effective once the meters and pay stations have been reprogrammed and the necessary signs are in place. Until that time, the prior ordinances shall continue to apply.

ORDINANCE

- (1) In Zone I and Zone II: from 89:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. daily.
- (2) In Zone III: from 89:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. daily.

2. In Section 320-49 “Time limits in parking lots”, delete the struck-through language and add the new underlined language as follows:

“§ 320-49. Time limits in parking lots.

A. Time limits in parking lots shall be as follows:

- (1) In Zone I, from 89:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m., daily, except for Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays, with a ninety minute time limit.
- (2) In Zone II, from 89:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m., daily, except for Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays, with a one hundred and twenty minute time limit.

- (3) In Zone III, from 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., daily, except for Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays, with no time limit.
- B. Overnight parking of private passenger vehicles shall be permitted in all public parking lots between the hours of 8:00 p.m. and 8:00 a.m.”

This ordinance shall become effective once the meters and pay stations have been reprogrammed and the necessary signs are in place, but no later than three (3) months from the date of final passage. Until that time, the prior ordinances shall continue to apply.
