



ORDINANCE

AMENDMENTS TO THE OVERNIGHT ON-STREET PARKING PILOT PROGRAM

CITY OF NASHUA

In the Year Two Thousand and Thirteen

The City of Nashua ordains that Part II “General Legislation”, Chapter 320 “Vehicles and Traffic”, Article XIII “Night Parking” Section 320-78.1 “Overnight on-street parking pilot program in designated downtown area” of the Nashua Revised Ordinances, as amended, be and hereby is further amended by deleting the struck-through language and adding new underlined language as follows:

“320-78.1. Overnight on-street parking pilot program in designated downtown area.

As an exception to the previous section, there shall be a pilot program for on-street overnight parking as described below.

- A. This pilot program shall expire December 31, 2014, which shall also conclude the first licensing period, unless reauthorized. The judgment regarding the success of the pilot program shall include, but not be limited to, the following factors:
1. the number of residents who obtain permits;
 2. a favorable recommendation from the Police Department;
 3. a favorable recommendation from the Fire Department; and
 4. a favorable recommendation from the Public Works Division.
- B. On-street overnight parking shall be allowed between the hours of 12:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. on designated streets only to vehicles with a permit. On-street overnight parking between the hours of 12:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. without a permit is a violation of § 320-78.
1. Residents of the streets where overnight parking is permitted will be allowed to purchase an annual permit, with a maximum number of 400 permits to be issued.

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- a. Residents of 13 Main Street are also allowed to purchase a permit.
 2. Applicants for a permit must show current proof of residence, to be demonstrated by a current New Hampshire vehicle registration certificate and one of the following additional documents:
 - a. Valid certificate of title;
 - b. Title application prepared by the Tax Collector that is not marked "non-resident";
 - c. Lease or rental agreement;
 - d. Notarized letter from a landlord at the address provided;
 - e. Mortgage statement at the address provided;
 - f. Any current utility bill with service at the address provided;
 - g. Property tax bill at the address provided; or
 - h. Government check, payroll check, payroll document or employment contract.
 3. Permits are not permitted for commercial vehicles, recreational vehicles, or boats.
 4. Permit stickers shall be displayed in the rear ~~passenger~~driver side window.
 5. Regardless of when the permit is obtained, the parking permit shall be effective to December 31, 2014, and the fee for every permit for a year or a portion of a year shall be \$10.00.
 6. Permits shall be issued by the City Clerk's Office, who shall maintain an electronic record of the number of permits per address.
 7. It is the intent of the Board of Aldermen that the revenue received from the issuance of permits will first cover the cost of administering the program, and any remaining revenue in excess of the administrative costs will be used for neighborhood improvements in the neighborhood in which permits are allowed.
- C. There shall be no overnight parking in areas where parking is not permitted during the daytime.
- D. There shall be no overnight parking during a declared snow emergency.
- E. There shall be no parking in the same location for more than forty-eight (48) consecutive hours.

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F. The streets where overnight parking is permitted are as follows:

Beech Street	From West Hollis Street to Pleasant Street
Cedar Street	South side
Central Street	From Chestnut Street to Pine Street
Chestnut Street	From Central Street to Kinsley Street
Elm Street	From West Pearl Street to Kinsley Street
Fletcher Street	North side
Green Street	West side
Hanover Street	From West Hollis Street to Kinsley Street
Kinsley Street	From Elm Chestnut Street to Badger Street
Oak Street	Entire length
Palm Street	From Central Street to Kinsley Street
Pierce Street	West side
Pine Street	From Central Street to Kinsley Street
Pleasant Street	North side
Vine Street	From Central Street to Kinsley Street
Walnut Street	From Central Street to Kinsley Street
West Hollis Street	From Elm Street to Palm Street
West Pearl Street	From Elm Street to Walnut Street
Wilder Street	From West Hollis Street to Kinsley Street

Permitted parking spaces on these streets shall be defined in paint. On-street overnight parking between the hours of 12:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. for vehicles with a permit must be in designated spaces. On-street overnight parking outside of a designated space between the hours of 12:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. for vehicles with or without a permit is a violation of § 320-78."

All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby superseded only to the extent necessary to effectuate this pilot program.

This ordinance shall become effective when the necessary permitting system and signage is in place.

ANALYSIS

This legislation makes several minor amendments to the recently passed overnight on-street parking pilot program in one specifically designated downtown area. It changes the required location for permit stickers, amends the permitted overnight parking section on Kinsley Street, and confirms that it will remain a violation of the overnight parking ordinance for vehicles parked overnight without permits, or vehicles parked outside of designated spaces.

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The City of Nashua ordains that Part II “General Legislation”, Chapter 320 “Vehicles and Traffic”, Article XIII “Night Parking” of the Nashua Revised Ordinances, as amended, be and hereby is further amended by deleting the struck-through language and adding new underlined language as follows:

“320-78. Parking time limits.

- A. Except as hereinafter provided, it shall be unlawful for an operator of any vehicle to park the vehicle for a period longer than two hours between 12:00 midnight and 6:00 a.m., daily, on any public way in the City where overnight on-street permit parking is not allowed. It shall be unlawful for an operator of any vehicle to park the vehicle for any time period between the hours of 12:00 midnight and 6:00 a.m., daily, without a permit on the public ways where overnight on-street permit parking is allowed.
- B. Anyone violating this provision shall be fined a minimum of \$25. If such fine is not paid within seven days, the fine shall increase by \$10, to \$35.
- C. Residences within the City of Nashua who have overnight guests occasionally may call the Police Department and ask for temporary relief from the overnight ban when their guests must park on city streets.

 4. a favorable recommendation from the Public Works Division.
- B. On-street overnight parking shall be allowed between the hours of 12:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. on designated streets only to vehicles with a permit. On-street overnight parking for any time period between the hours of 12:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. on designated streets without a permit is a violation of § 320-78 and is not allowed.
1. Residents of the streets where overnight parking is permitted will be allowed to purchase an annual permit, with a maximum number of 400 permits to be issued.
 - a. Residents of 13 Main Street are also allowed to purchase ~~a permit~~.
 - b. Residents of Buck Street are also allowed to purchase permits.
 2. Applicants for a permit must show current proof of residence, to be demonstrated by a current New Hampshire vehicle registration certificate or proof of vehicle's insurance at that residence and one of the following additional documents:
 - a. Valid certificate of title;
 - b. Title application prepared by the Tax Collector that is not marked "non-resident";
 - c. Lease or rental agreement;
 - d. Notarized letter from a landlord at the address provided;
 - e. Mortgage statement at the address provided;
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
