



ORDINANCE

ESTABLISHING A VALET PARKING PROGRAM

CITY OF NASHUA

In the Year Two Thousand and Fifteen

The City of Nashua ordains that Part II “General Legislation”, Chapter 320 “Vehicles and Traffic”, Article XI “Parking Meters” of the Nashua Revised Ordinances, as amended, be and hereby is further amended by adding the following new section:

“§ 320-53.1. Valet parking.

- A. Valet parking shall be allowed between the hours of 4:00 p.m. and 12:00 a.m. in Zone I, as defined in Section 320-51, only to persons or businesses with a license.
- B. Application for a valet parking license shall be made to the Transportation Department Manager, or a person designated by said Manager.
- C. Applicants for a valet parking license must:
 - (1) Be in good standing with the State of New Hampshire.
 - (2) Have adequate insurance.
 - (3) Provide a map, application and supporting materials as requested by the Director.
 - (4) Agree to terms and conditions set by the City, as reviewed by Corporation Counsel, including but not limited to damage reimbursement, indemnification of the City, compliance will all applicable laws and revocation provisions.
 - (5) Show proof of an agreement with private lots or the City in municipal lots/garages to park cars.

- D. The Transportation Department Manager, or a person designated by said Manager, may issue licenses to applicants who meet all the requirements, as long as issuing said licenses will not unnecessarily interfere with public parking.
- E. The license shall be valid for one (1) year from April 1 to March 31 of the following year. Licenses may be issued for all days of the week or be limited to specific days of the week. The license holder is responsible for ensuring a timely renewal of the license.
- F. The fee shall be \$5 per space per day of the license. Payment shall be due at the first of the month. Failure to pay shall be cause for revocation of license.
- G. Licenses are not transferable.
- H. Licenses may be revoked by the Transportation Department Manager, or a person designated by said Manager, for cause and upon the giving of reasonable notice to the license holder.
- I. Valet services licensed by the City must be offered free to the public, although tips are acceptable.
- J. The license shall be for a maximum of three (3) parallel parking spaces.
- K. Within one parking space, a key storage, podium, pop-up tent and signage shall be allowed. No encumbrances are allowed on the sidewalk.
- L. There shall be no valet parking during a declared snow emergency or during other street closings in Zone I, as scheduled or allowed by the City.
- M. Violations of this Section shall be punishable in accordance with Section 1-12."

All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby superseded only to the extent necessary to effectuate this program.

This ordinance shall become effective when the necessary permitting system is in place.
