



ORDINANCE

RESCINDING THE AUTHORIZATION FOR PARKING METERS ON A PORTION OF GARDEN STREET

CITY OF NASHUA

In the Year Two Thousand and Fifteen

The City of Nashua ordains that Part II “General Legislation”, Chapter 320 “Vehicles and Traffic” Article XI “Parking Meters”, Section 320-51 “Parking meter streets”, subsection A of the Nashua Revised Ordinances, as amended, be hereby further amended by deleting the struck-through language and adding the new underlined language as follows:

“§ 320-51. Parking meter streets.

The following streets are designated as parking meter streets in the listed zones, and authority is hereby granted to install and maintain parking meters on these streets in appropriate locations:

A. Zone I.

Name of Street	Side	Location

Garden Street	West	Adjacent to the Elm Street Parking Garage, <u>excluding spaces reserved for use of the transit system</u> ”

All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

This ordinance shall become effective at the time of removal of the parking meters and removal and/or installation of the appropriate sign(s).

ANALYSIS

This legislation removes the authorization for several parking meters on Garden Street.

The transit system indicated a need for nearby available parking for two paratransit vans used for regular daily relief operations at shift switches and lunches. Its intention is to retain the three handicapped spots located closest to the southeast corner of the garage and reserve the next three spaces to the north (that were metered) for use by two paratransit vans. (Three spaces are required to accommodate two vans.)
