RELATIVE TO THE TRANSFER OF \$1,990 FROM DEPARTMENT 194 – “CONTINGENCY”, ACCOUNT #70100 – “GENERAL CONTINGENCY” INTO THE CITY CLERK GENERAL FUND OPERATING BUDGET TO COVER EXPENSES FOR THE SPECIAL ELECTION FOR STATE REPRESENTATIVE, DISTRICT 31 (WARD 4)

RESOLVED by the Board of Aldermen of the City of Nashua that the sum of \$1,990 be transferred from Department 194 – “Contingency”, Account #70100 – “General Contingency” into Department 107 City Clerk, General Fund Operating Budget, Accounting Classification 51 Salaries & Wages - \$1,940 and 61 Supplies & Materials - \$50 for the purpose of covering expenses for the special election for State Representative, District 31 (Ward 4).


ANALYSIS

This resolution authorizes the transfer of \$1,990 from general contingency into the City Clerk General Fund Operating Budget to cover the expenses of the special election for State Representative for District 31, Ward 4. Under Charter Section 24, the funds are to be appropriated at the time the Board of Aldermen orders the warrants to be posted.

R-13-089 sets the polling hours for the February 19, 2013 special election as required under RSA 659:4 and issues precepts to the Selectmen of Ward 4 directing them to post their warrants as required under NRO 23-8. According to the City Clerk, polling hours must be set “no later than 30 days prior to a state election” (RSA 659:4); therefore, rules will need to be suspended so that R-13-089 can have a second reading and final passage at the January 8, 2013 Board of Aldermen meeting. Since the charter requires that funding for the special election be appropriated at the time the Board issues orders to post the warrants, this resolution, which funds the cost of this special election, will also require a second reading and final passage on January 8, 2013.


