



RESOLUTION

RELATIVE TO THE ADOPTION OF THE FISCAL YEAR 2016 PROPOSED BUDGET FOR THE CITY OF NASHUA GENERAL, ENTERPRISE, AND SPECIAL REVENUE FUNDS

CITY OF NASHUA

In the Year Two Thousand and Fifteen

RESOLVED by the Board of Aldermen of the City of Nashua that the Fiscal Year 2016 Proposed Budget for the General Fund of the City of Nashua be and is hereby adopted, and that the following amounts are hereby appropriated for the several accounts and for other needs of the City of Nashua General Fund for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2015, and ending June 30, 2016, and for the purpose of Section 50-a et seq. of the Nashua Revised City Charter, as amended, each item of this budget shall be considered as a separate appropriation. The proposed General Fund appropriation amount is \$244,770,057 with estimated General Fund Revenues of \$60,661,896 including estimated state funding for education in the amount of \$35,522,796.

That Fiscal Year 2016 Proposed Budget for the Enterprise Funds of the City of Nashua be and is hereby adopted, and that the following amounts are hereby appropriated for the several accounts and for other needs of the City of Nashua Enterprise Funds for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2015 and ending June 30, 2016, and the purpose of Section 50-a et. seq. of the Nashua Revised City Charter, as amended, each item of this budget shall be considered as a separate appropriation. The proposed Enterprise Funds appropriation amount is \$26,915,372 (inclusive of anticipated Capital Appropriations), with estimated Enterprise Funds Revenues of \$23,024,747 and any additional funding for capital and CSO-related expenditures from retained earnings, bonding and/or State Revolving Fund Loans.

That Fiscal Year 2016 Proposed Budget for the Special Revenue Funds of the City of Nashua be and is hereby adopted, and that the following amounts are hereby appropriated for the several accounts and for other needs of the City of Nashua Special Revenue Funds for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2015 and ending June 30, 2016. The proposed Special Funds appropriation amount is \$18,219,820 with estimated Special Revenue Funds Revenues of \$18,219,820.

Contingent on the passage of resolution R-15-137 and pursuant to NRO § 5-145, E: the accumulated sum of all appropriations of the FY2016 combined annual municipal budget is \$260,471,617. The FY2016 dollar amount under the limit established by City Charter Section 56-c is \$105,276.

ANALYSIS

This resolution establishes and authorizes the Fiscal Year 2016 Proposed Budget for the General Fund of the City of Nashua for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2015, and ending June 30, 2016. For the purpose of Section 50-a et seq. of the Nashua Revised City Charter, as amended, each item of this budget shall be considered as a separate appropriation.


A public hearing on the budget shall be held before its adoption by the board of aldermen with at least seven days notice. Nashua City Charter § 56-a; NRO § 5-8.

The board of aldermen may reduce any item(s) in the budget by a majority vote, but an increase or addition requires a vote of two-thirds of the members of the board. Nashua City Charter §56-b.

The budget shall be finally adopted not later than August 1, 2015. Nashua City Charter § 56-b.




