AMENDING THE USE OF FUNDING BY THE GREATER NASHUA COUNCIL ON ALCOHOLISM IN THE FISCAL YEAR 2004 COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT

RESOLVED by the Board of Aldermen of the City of Nashua

WHEREAS Resolution R-03-176 (AMENDED) authorized funding of \$50,000 to the Greater Nashua Council on Alcoholism to modify the facility at Pine Street Extension (known as Keystone Hall) to allow inpatient residential treatment of persons seeking recovery from addictive disorders by creating semi-private rooms; and

WHEREAS the Greater Nashua Council on Alcoholism has requested that the funds instead be utilized for engineering and architectural work at their proposed new location at 59 Factory Street.

NOW THEREFORE the Greater Nashua Council on Alcoholism is granted permission to use the \$50,000 from the Fiscal Year 2004 Community Development Block Grant for engineering and architectural work at their proposed new location at 59 Factory Street.
